They were guided by several of our great Docents and seemed to have a good time. Up on the bridge, they had many questions for our Bridge Docent about the navigation equipment as well as enjoying the view from the CO's chair.

That same week, museum staff had the distinct pleasure of interviewing Alfred J. Payne, who lives in the Bay Area, a veteran of the USS Hornet CV 8 and the USS Bennington CV 20, where Alfred served as an Aviation Machinist's Mate (Propeller mechanic). His granddaughter had contacted the museum a few weeks ago to tell us that he had celebrated his 100th birthday on May 4th. She had asked if we had information on other former CV 8 crew members who might still be around. I contacted Sandy Burket who was able to provide contact information on four other survivors which I passed along to the museum staff and Alfred's granddaughter. This encounter led to our request for the interview with Alfred, which turned out to be quite inspiring. With an amazingly clear memory of events from more than 80 years ago, he brought our staff back to that historic period. It was a real honor to have such an opportunity.


WELCOME TO THE SPRINGS!

Welcome to Colorado Springs - the Home of the U.S. Air Force Academy

The "Springs" is located at the eastern foot of the Rocky Mountains. It lies near glacier-carved Pikes Peak, a national landmark featuring a cog railway leading to its 14,115-foot summit. The city's Garden of the Gods Park features iconic red-sandstone formations and mountain views. It is also home to the venerable Air Force Academy. Come and join us for what is sure to be a terrific time in *The Springs!*

HOTEL INFORMATION

We will be staying at the newly renovated **Embassy Suites** Hotel located at 7290 Commerce Center Drive, Colorado Springs, CO 80919. The hotel room rate is just \$155 plus tax per night. The room rate includes a hot breakfast buffet, served daily and 2 free drinks nightly, during reunion dates.



For those of you who choose to arrive early or stay late, the same room rate is available three days prior and three days after, <u>based on availability</u>. Make your hotel reservations NOW to insure the best availability. You may cancel without penalty up to 72 hours in advance.

The most reliable way to make hotel reservations is to enter tinyurl.com/r44rbsh2 into your browser to make hotel reservations on-line. Enter your travel dates and follow the

prompts. Or you may try and reach or message Veronica, the Reservation Manager, directly at the hotel (Mon-Fri only, from 9-4 MST). Call Veronica at (719)-599-9100. Request the USS Hornet /Constellation group rate of \$155/night. If not busy the front desk may also be able to help. All rooms are Suites. Mountain View rooms are an extra \$40 more per night. Reservations are due by July 23.

Note: a limited number of 2 bedded suites available. If you need one, book now! If you have any problems getting a room at the group rate, especially if you are coming in early or staying late, please call Military Reunion Planners (MRP) at 817-251-3551. We can resolve *most* hotel issues.

AIRPORT TRANSPORTATION & PARKING

Colorado Springs (COS) is the closest to the hotel. IF you are renting a car, consider flying into Denver as it's often cheaper and only about an hour away. You will need to make arrangements for a ride to the hotel, from either airport, as there is no shuttle. Uber is probably your best bet.

For those who are driving, the hotel offers plenty of free parking. If you need specific directions call the hotel's front desk (719) 599-9100 for assistance.


Monday, August 19 (7:00 pm)

RIDING CITY TOUR OF THE SPRINGS AND GARDEN OF THE GODS

Enjoy hearing and seeing the city's history now in its 150th year! Next, we take an incredible ride through the famous Garden of the Gods Imagine dramatic views, 300' towering sandstone rock formations against a backdrop of snow-capped Pikes Peak and brilliant blue skies. This is the most visited attraction in the region, and a National Landmark. Have your cameras ready as this is one of the most photographed natural wonders in the United States! Lunch will be on your own in the outdoor pavilion at the state's oldest and largest *Trading Post*.

PIKE'S PEAK COG RAIL EXCURSION & MANITOU SPRINGS

Wednesday, August 21 (9:00am-3:00pm)

Board our motorcoach and head to the Train Station where we will board the exciting Cog Rail train up Pike's



Peak. This is the world's highest and longest cog railroad, you may spot elk, bighorn sheep, coyotes and more on your 9-mile, 70-minute journey to the top of this 14,115-foot National Historic Landmark. More than just a mountain, *Pike's Peak* is emotionally moving; this is the place that inspired "America the Beautiful", written by Katharine Lee Bates. Her experience in 1893 on top of Pikes Peak moved her to pen the poem that became one of the most patriotic songs honoring America. Pikes Peak is a must see but be mindful of the height if you have any difficulty with breathing (check with your Doc) and you will need a warm coat as it's cold up there. There are restrooms, snack bar and of course a gift shop at the peak. The Pike's Peak Cog Railway just re-opened after many years and is one of the most unique experiences in the country – don't miss it!

After our journey you will have time in Manitou Springs for browsing the many interesting boutiques and have lunch on your own.

ALTERNATIVE TOUR - OLD COLORADO CITY & MANITOU SPRINGS EXCURSION

Wednesday, August 21 (9:00am-3:00pm)

If *Pike's Peak* isn't on your radar today, you may opt for a guided tour of the areas two most historic and unique attractions, <u>Old Colorado City</u> and <u>Manitou Springs</u>. Learn the fascinating history of each before having time to explore over 100 boutiques, one-of-a-kind shops, and cafés, of each. Stroll the sidewalks browsing and maybe enjoying an ice cream cone. We will meet up with the rest of the group for lunch on our own, before returning to the hotel.

The National Museum of World War II Aviation is world class. This museum has a new layout with several individual sections that cover different conflicts and the planes that served them. Enjoy a guided, walking tour, conducted by ex-veterans, anxious to answer your questions about this truly *fantastic* museum, which is extremely well done. There is also a fabulous gift shop for shoppers. Don't miss it! PS - Bring a snack and comfortable walking shoes. Lunch will be on your own once we get back to the hotel.

COUNTRY WESTERN SHOW AND BBQ AT THE FLYING W RANCH
