Veterans Day Commemoration

- November 11, 2024
- 10:00 AM - 05:00 PM
- at USS Hornet Museum

The event will include the Hornet Horns playing the National Anthem, guest speaker Steve Minnear, a wreath laying ceremony at the fantail, a flyover from the Memorial Squadron and more.

Steve Minnear's * presentation is titled: **Before Anchors Aweigh: How the San Francisco Bay Area Got Sailors to the USS Hornet and the Pacific Theatre.** Many people know the story of how the Navy's sailors fought World War II in the Pacific. But few know how the sailors got to their ships. Even fewer know how the San Francisco Bay Area played a critical role in moving Naval personnel from all over the United States on to ships to fight the war in the Pacific. Historian Steve **Minnear** will tell how three now unknown Navy bases near Dublin, California shipped over 350,000 sailors, Marines and Coast Guardsmen to war. And how the USS Hornet brought many back as part of Operation Magic Carpet.

The **USS Hornet Memorial Squadron** will conduct a flyover of the ship at 12:30 PM.

Film maker George Reletas will be unveiling a trailer to his new movie "Sundown to Eleven" and if you've seen his other video projects, you know this will be good!

In addition, we are partnering with the **Alameda County Veterans Commission for Operation Greenlight.** In the evenings from Nov 4th to the 11th we will be shining a green light in our island structure in support of our Veterans.

Finally, we are partnering with **Seatrek for their Veterans Day at Sea Trek.** They are honoring veterans and highlighting the rich military history of the Bay Area with a special scenic Alameda Waterfront kayak tour.

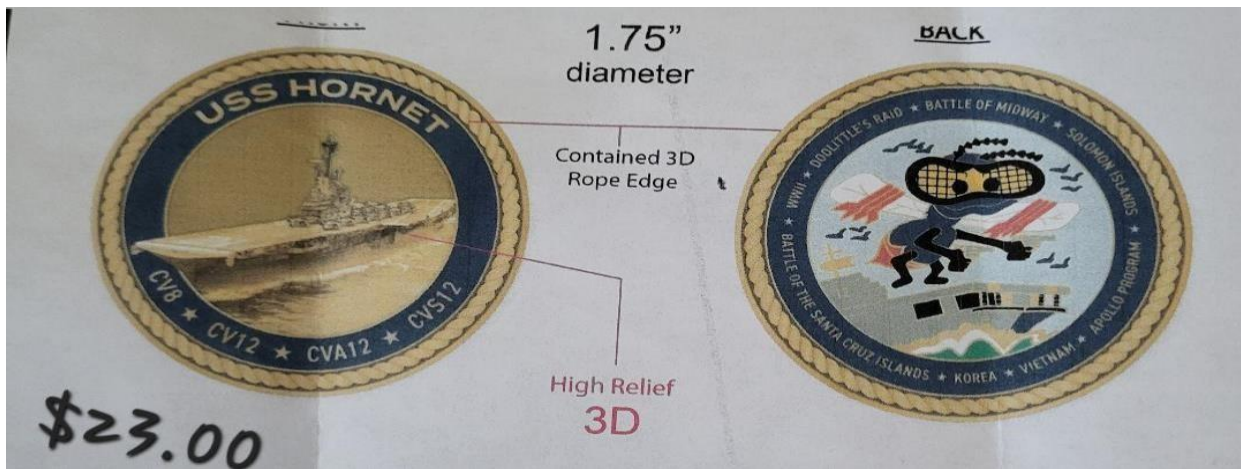

2024 General Business Meeting

Before the meeting was called to order, Ray Casey discussed where the 2025 Reunion would be. He passed out papers ballots to vote on one of three cities at the banquet. The cities are Nashville, TN, Harrisburg, PA and Valley Forge, PA. None of these **hotels** have shuttles.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman of the Board, Kenn Livingston.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and led by Carmen Simbari.

Sandy Burket stated that the 2023 USS Hornet general business meeting minutes were published in the November 2023 "Hornet Buzz" for all to read to save time at the meeting. A motion was made to approve the minutes as printed was made by John Webster and seconded by Francis Gutowski. Motion carried.

The treasurer's report was given by Treasurer, Mariane Gezich. Marianne stated that this report was not a full year's report because of the reunion being early. The report is from September 1, 2023, to July 31, 2023. General Fund balance – beginning balance -\$16,781.82, income - \$8,958.00, expenses - \$13,670.39, ending balance -\$12,069.43, Memorial Fund balance – beginning balance - \$12,033.06, income \$6,350.00, no expenses, ending balance - \$18,383.06, Ship's Store balance – beginning balance – 2,012.17, income - \$911.04, expenses - \$1,118.04, ending balance -\$1,805.17. Marianne stated that we were getting to the point where our expenses were more than our income.

The motion to accept the minutes as read was made by Carmen Simbari and seconded by Randy Wolff. Motion carried.

The Ship's Store report was given by John Webster. He stated that he has made \$700.00 so far at the ship's store. John said he had challenge coins for sale and only had a few left, do get them before he sells out

Under unfinished business Sandy Burket reported that at the Board of Directors meeting * we voted to move Kenn Livingston from Vice-Chairman to Chairman of the Board. He will take it for the next

year and then he will revisit his decision as to what he wants to do next. He said that there are some chores connected with Vice-chair, and he will continue to do those. He would like to see someone step up and fill the Vice-chairman's position in case he needs to step down. He asked if there was anyone that would like to volunteer to for Vice-chairman. A question was asked if you had to be a member of ship's company. Sandy said that we have had a family member as president but have not had one as Chairman or Vice-chairman. Francis Gutkowski asked if the duties of vice-chairman could be read and maybe that would help someone decide. Marianne * read the duties. She sends a list of memorial certificates to be sent out, * the bank statements for you to go over along with a printout of that month's bank statement so you can see where our money is going. Kenn stated that he would come back to vice-chairman under new business.

A motion was made at the Board of Directors meeting to suspend the website because of not having much participation in it. Under discussion Paul Edwards suggested that we contact the Museum to see if they could put a link on their website for us. Discussion followed. We need a motion to table suspending * the website until we hear back from Paul. Under new business, the three cities for the 2025 Reunion are Nashville, TN, Harrisburg, PA and Valley Forge, PA. Remember to bring your ballot to the banquet to vote.

The need for a * president for 2025 was brought up. SuzAnne Eubanks was mentioned. She said if the reunion was in Nashville she would help. Sandy will check to see if she is willing to be President for 2025.

Kenn asked for nominations for Honoree for 2025. Debby Cass nominated Bennie Bachicha for honoree. The motion was made by Gary Rinehart and seconded by Francis Gutowski to have Benny Bachicha as honoree for 2025. Motion carried.

A motion to get a plaque for recognition for Ray Casey was made by Randy Wolff and seconded by Mary Foley. The motion carried.

A motion was made by Randy Wolff and seconded by Chuck Olmstead to get a Hornet plaque to Capt. Greg Thomas for the Thomas B. Doherty High School for his project. Motion carried.

Francis Gutowski volunteered to be Vice-chairman is there was nothing in the by-laws that would prevent a family member from holding that office.

A motion was made by Randy Wolff and seconded by Chuck Olmstead to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried.
