March 2025

As I am writing this article, I'm looking out the window to a beautiful early spring morning. Our Rio Vista golf course where we live looks great, and I will be out there later this morning, hoping for a good round with my fellow golfers.

As always, this time of year, life at the USS Hornet Museum is picking up, with improved attendance, youth overnight visits, and a variety of unique events. More on that in a bit.

For our aircraft enthusiasts, I want to mention a fun visit to the Museum. We live about ten miles from Travis Air Force base. Since I have access to the base, I occasionally go to the PX and Commissary. During one of my visits a few months ago, I decided to visit their Aviation Museum. They have an incredible display of near new and vintage Air Force aircraft, as well as many historic displays. I spoke with several volunteers, and mentioned the USS Hornet Museum, which none of them had visited. Well, a few weeks ago I met a couple of them at Alameda Pier, and brought them onboard for a great tour. They were fascinated with the ship, but also with our great collection of restored Navy aircraft. They said they would be back with other Travis volunteers in the near future. New friends for the Hornet.

I was recently contacted by Dr. Matthew Fash, the National Coordinator of the United States Navy Memorial Stories of Service Program and Student Interview Program. This year, one of their East Coast schools visited the USS New Jersey, interviewed Veterans, and created short documentaries to Honor, Recognize, and Celebrate the men and women of the Sea Services, past, present, and future; and to Inform the public about their service. One of their West Coast schools is near the USS Hornet, and he wanted to see if they could arrange a visit for their student team to work on the same project that their East Coast team just completed. I should mention that Matthew is the proud grandson of AM1 Philip Antoniello, survivor of the USS Hornet CV-8. He reminded me of his visit to the Hornet with his grandfather some years ago, where I escorted them around the museum. He felt it would be an honor for the USS Hornet to be the first museum ship for their West Coast students to visit.

Their vision of the visit would be for the students and teacher advisors to film their experiences, impressions, and knowledge gained by touring the ship. The student team would also interview any Veterans willing to share their service memories from their time on Hornet. Any museum team members are willing to share their experiences and reflections of maintaining and telling Hornet's story would also be an outstanding addition to their documentaries. The documentaries would then be presented at a student film festival presented by the Navy Memorial on May 22nd and aired on all Navy Memorial platforms on Memorial Day for a National audience.

I have passed his request to the museum leadership, in hopes of scheduling this worthwhile effort.

Updates from the Museum

From Ship Operations: "In 2024, we were able to repair the main water line from the pier, install a new electrical box on the flight deck, restore the L1 Elevator Pit, Repaint J.O.B., identify main leak points and repairs on the flight deck, restore the Crow's Nest, update the safety lighting in Special Weapons, and so much more! In 2025, our main priority is to fix all the leaks in the Flight Deck to minimize the water damage from unopened compartments."

From Air Group & Tours: "We were able to add a new Firepower Tour as well as finalize the restoration of our T-28 Aircraft Project. Our F-4 Phantom project is also almost completed as we place the final decals this month."

From Radio Group: "In 2024, the ARDC Grant helped us to repair the Hornet antennas and update our communications equipment. This allowed us to make over 2,200 radio contacts! We were also able to appeal to the Navy to have the Hornet's historic active duty call sign, NBGC, reinstated."

<u>We are also proud to report</u> over 55 community events were hosted on deck in 2024! Our most popular being our July 4th Celebration, Monsters Bash Halloween Party, and Apollo 11 Splashdown!

Sampler of upcoming events

<u>March 14 - 15</u>. We hold our overnight youth scavenger hunt. This event includes some parents.

March 15. Special restoration behind the scenes tour. More detailed than regular visits.

<u>March 22.</u> CarrierCon. This is a special event held each year, where the Museum engages with new audiences and broadens awareness of the Museum and its mission of education and preservation of history and science. This event allows fans to not only enjoy one of the most unique conventions in the United States but to discover the USS Hornet in a way entirely unique to them.
